JASON'S JOURNAL - The Principal's Message

It seems like only yesterday when we (appropriately) concluded semester one with a Prep performance of "Everything is Awesome" at Assembly.

Thank you to all who attended our Parent Teacher Interviews at the end of last term; as the home-school partnership is strengthened by your attendance and is significant in the educational success experienced by your child. These interviews were an important part of the reporting process, as not all information can be conveyed in a written report. The process of discussing the achievements, the areas of future focus and the path to achieve future goals, is one that is best achieved through parents, teachers and students working together. I know all children across BLPS are very proud of their individual portfolios (with a reminder to please return these to school if you haven't already done so).

Remember that communication is a two-way street so please contact your child's teacher if you have any queries or concerns. Please also make sure that you find time to read our 'Lakeside News' every Thursday afternoon (when published online). There is always a great deal happening around the school, often articulated through this important communicative process.

WELCOME TO NEW STAFF

As we greeted everyone back to school following the holidays, we also welcomed a few new students and some new staff.

Following a selection process at the end of last term, we welcome Lisa Genovese to the role of 5/6N class teacher. I'm sure you'll join me in congratulating Lisa on her appointment and we look forward to the contributions she will be able to make to Blackburn Lake Primary School, with her previous teaching experiences in both state and private school sectors.

As part of this school's ongoing commitment to the induction and development of new teachers, we are pleased to welcome Prue Ainsworth (pictured right) to the school. Prue is completing her Master of Teaching at Deakin University and has already qualified to teach as a graduate teacher, completing all requirements to become a probationary registered teacher with the Victorian Institute of Teaching, however she has chosen to commence her teaching career as an Intern. We welcome Prue for the entirety of this term, as she works under the expert guidance of Kym Morgan (in 5/6K), sharing full responsibility for planning, developing, teaching, assessing and reporting for the class.

We also welcome for the next month Letizia Antolini, a high school student from Grosseto in Tuscany who is interested in our Australian and Victorian primary education system and is assisting Vincey Montesalvo during Italian classes. Letizia has been inundated with questions from our students about the Italian school system and way of life. If you see Letizia please introduce yourself (as Letizia speaks English very well).







CLASS VISIT - 5/6K



The whole school text focus for the start of this term is the genre of narrative (story). The children of 5/6K have been discussing the differences between literal and figurative language, and on Tuesday the students worked in mixed ability groups on a number of ways to improve interesting narrative writing: focusing on synonyms, alliterations, metaphors and onomatopoeias (the naming of a thing or action – as pictured "ha ha ha" in one of the children's work on the iPad).



The class worked well as individuals on their tasks, with Prue Ainsworth assisting the iPad group and Kym Morgan supporting another group. It was clear that our senior students have been skilled up to be "thinkers" when reading – evidenced with a high level of independence shown by the children in organising themselves, as they readily located the tools needed for each task. A pleasant surprise for me was when my group suggested "let's have a dictionary war!" when we were unsure of a word meaning when reading the tongue twister "lovely lemon liniment". I congratulate the children for challenging themselves (adding that I successfully stumped the students of 5/6K with my tongue twister "unique New York"!) and also thank Kym Morgan and all the teachers of Blackburn Lake Primary School for planning engaging activities for the students of the school.

PLANNING WEEK

I am often asked about our school class structure and whether your child is in a multi-age class or "straight class" is a mostly irrelevant discussion. This is due to the wide range of academic needs, behavioural needs and social needs – whether a straight class or not – that are met by the teacher. Chronological age does not determine needs. As we begin planning for 2015, our school's policy is to preferably have straight classes, however this is not always possible or equitable – this year as an example in Grade 5/6, we created balanced classes with the highest total being 25 students (which would not have been possible with a straight class model).

Further to this, our teaching teams are not based on sole grade levels. This fortnight teams of teachers are released to plan together this term's lessons, aiming to improve Literacy and Numeracy outcomes, as well as Integrated Studies (inquiry) units of work in line with our school's two-year scope and sequence planner. Current Whole School Swimming and the Life Education Van Programs support this fortnight's Health Investigation. Please be aware that in releasing class teachers to plan a rigorous curriculum together, the children will have other teachers (casual relief teachers or specialist teachers) on the Planning Days of:

- Prep - Friday 18th July (tomorrow)

- Grade 1/2 - Wednesday 23rd July

Grade 3/4 - Thursday 17th July (today)

- Grade 5/6 - Tuesday 22nd July

SPECIAL RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION (SRI)

"If a principal receives notification from an accredited and approved instructor that the instructor is available to deliver special religious instruction at the school the principal must offer parents of children enrolled at the school the opportunity for their children to be provided with special religious instruction."

Earlier this week a new (prescribed) form was issued for families containing all the information required by the new Ministerial Direction to be provided to parents to obtain informed consent. I was instructed not to amend this form in any way prior to distribution, as it contains information pertinent to the newly written legislation.

It is important that those families still wishing to partake in this program sign the recently issued permission form and return this to their class teacher ASAP - or by this time next week (Thursday). No children will be placed in SRI unless parental consent is provided for a child to participate ("opt in"). Thank you for the responses we have already received through the office. As you will have read in the last *Lakeside News* I have made the decision to withhold SRI classes for the first two weeks of this term, allowing us some time to distribute forms and calculate logistics as to those children participating and not participating.

INTENSIVE SWIMMING PROGRAM



Due to the availability of Nunawading Aquatic Centre our Whole School Swimming Program takes place at the start of term three. This week I visited and witnessed the students fully immersed in their lessons. I applaud the children for their organisation that is required when attending swimming sessions (and also parents for packing bags and labelling belongings). Thank you also to Phil Lumsden for his coordination of this program which complements our Health and Physical Education program at Blackburn Lake Primary School.

To enable the program's provision on this occasion we accepted payment after the due date. With the complexities of logistics and organisation, please understand that in future we will require all payments before the designated due date.

Due to a number of classes out of the school tomorrow afternoon at our whole school swimming program there will be no assembly tomorrow. Have a good Friday and a great weekend,




